- 3.) Agreement between the Town of Andes and Andes Central School to share the Town's fuel pumps with them effective July 1, 2014. They have agreed to pay for the fuel used and any repairs on a shared basis.
- 4.) The Town of Andes started the Decal sticker program for the transfer station on January 1, 2014. If you do not have a sticker you will no longer be allowed to use the transfer station.
- *Suzanne Gladstone brought up a farm program now being offered by Delaware County. If you bring your plastic and twine to Walton, they recycle it.
- **Supervisor Donnelly advised the board of an issue with the transfer station permits that had been brought to his attention. There are many homes in town that have multiple owners or who have relatives that frequently come to stay when the home owner is not there. These individuals should bring along a letter from the landowner as well as a utility bill to indicate their permission to use the transfer station.

AGREEMENT FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF HIGHWAY MONEYS

AGREEMENT between the Town Superintendent of the Town of _______, Delaware County, New York, and the undersigned members of the Town Board.
