RE: Catskill Park

-Mr. White spoke in reference to the proposed resolution before the board to support a \$4 million dollar budget line item for the Catskill Park in the NYS budget. He stated that the Adirondack Park and other parks in the state have budget line items and that this has been a work in progress for many years.

*Joe Eisele

RE: Cell Towers

-Mr. Eisele asked the board if the proposed sites for the potential cell phone towers are Bobcat, the Liddle farm, and the highway garage. Supervisor Donnelly confirmed that these locations are being considered. Mr. Eisele stated that he is concerned by the location at the highway garage due to the proximity to the homes nearby, many which have small children, and the highway garage itself and its employees because of the radiation that will be given off by the towers. He questioned what the town's plans are and if there will be studies done concerning the health risks. Supervisor Donnelly stated that bringing cell service to the area has been a work in progress for the past 10 years. The details of any locations or exact plans are not final yet. He also stated that a potential site would be on Palmer Hill. The town would like to utilize the site at the highway garage because it is already town owned property. Mr. Eisele asked if a study has been done yet to see if the potential sites are even viable. Supervisor Donnelly stated that the cell tower company Krydon Group is reviewing the sites but does not have the results yet. In the past however there have been verbal commitments that the sites mentioned would be fine. He also stated that others have volunteered sites for the towers, one being down near the reservoir.

The temporary cell tower in Margaretville was referenced. Supervisor Donnelly was not sure if any town funds paid for this or if it was State funded. Mr. Eisele asked if the cell towers were to be funded by the town. Councilman Gladstone stated that they would not, there is grant money to pay for them. The rent paid by the carriers that lease the towers would be split between the town and the landowners. He also mentioned that broadband is another option being considered. Mr. Eisele asked if there will be public notices and hearings in regards to the choice of sites. Supervisor Donnelly stated that there would be.

*John Moffett

RE: Water District and Sewer District

-Mr. Moffett stated that the spring lines are causing concern. The filters are having to be changed out every three weeks or more frequently. Delaware Operations would like permission to investigate a new well so that the water district could stop using the spring. This would also do away with the costly filtration system that currently has to be used. He would like to contact Titan Drilling to see if they have any history on an old well at the same location and see if they feel this would be a good site for a new well. Supervisor Donnelly stated that a Smart Growth Grant has been applied for in order to do this.

He also discussed the infiltration and inflow study that Delaware Operations has requested permission to have done. The ground water has put the plant over the permit limit but not above the design of the plant. Councilman Gladstone asked if this would put the permit with NYS

DEC in jeopardy. Mr. Moffett stated that they are understanding of the situation and as long as steps are taken to fix the issue, such as the I & I study we will be fine.

Supervisor's Report

1.) On 3/31/2015 Marge, Bud, Tom and I met at the Town Hall with the folks from Krydon, a cell tower provider. It was a very good meeting they took the information we had concerning possible sites. They asked if we had the coordinates, longitude and latitude for the sites. I told them no but I would have it by Friday for them. I called them on Wednesday and gave them the coordinates.

2.) Last month we discussed the proposed request to add a line item in the state budget for the Catskill Park. Delaware County Planning, Alan White, and the towns and counties concerned have worked out the concerns that some others and I have had. In the meantime our two Senators Bonacic and Seward have put in a \$500,000 line in the budget to get it started. Alan White will be here today and I suggest we support this proposal.

3.) A very questionable vote was taken by one of our boards that had to be retaken since the first one was not legal. It should be noted that we take our legal advice from the Town Attorney to protect Andes from legal problems.

4.) We have on our desks the local law to establish our flood commission. We will need a motion to approve or reject this law.

5.) The DEC should be awarding the funding for Smart Growth projects soon. We have asked for two, Ballantine Park and water supply improvements each for \$75,000

6.) If you can help plant and dig some trees to be replanted in Ballantine Park on the weekend of April 25th please let us know.

7.) I want to thank the highway crew for the great job they did this winter on our roads.

8.) Mary Davis requested permission to have an ice cream social in Ballantine Park at the end of May. We should okay this tonight. I have already spoken with Matt Sluiter and we will be covered.

9.) The court building project is coming along very well. We had to cancel the carpet delivery until this week due to the siding storage.

*Councilman Gladstone brought up the issue of what will be done with the old court building. He would like to start the process of advertising to sell it.

Resolution 11 of 2015 Establishing a Resolution Supporting a \$4 Million Dollar Budget Line Item for the Catskill Park and Catskill Forest Preserve

WHEREAS, the Catskill region is home to the Catskill Park, established by the State of New York in 1904 and the Catskill Forest Preserve lands;

WHEREAS, 705,000 acres of land within the “Blue Line”, 287,500 acres of Catskill Forest Preserve land exist for public enjoyment; and

WHEREAS, the economic impact of outdoor recreational activities that rely on public and protected lands attracted a total of more than 1.7 million visitors with an estimated economic impact greater than \$46 million, supporting 980 jobs, and

WHEREAS, all outdoor recreational activities, including both those that rely on public and protected lands and those that rely on private lands, attracted nearly 2.5 million visitors with an estimated economic impact of more than \$115 million, supporting 2,413 jobs; and

WHEREAS, operations of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation and the New York City Department of Environmental Protection generated an economic impact of \$62.4 million, supporting 1,571 jobs (an estimate judged to be highly speculative with actual impacts presumed to be significantly greater); and

WHEREAS, much of the economic activity of the region is focused on the preserved lands of the region; and

WHEREAS, stewardship and maintenance of these lands are critical for the continued use and enjoyment of the region, to strengthen the economy, and protect the vital ecosystem services of the region;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Town of Andes supports the establishment of a budget line item for the Catskill Park and Catskill Forest Preserve within the Counties of Ulster, Delaware, Sullivan and Greene, beginning fiscal year 2015-16 and ongoing,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk shall forward certified copies of this resolution to Governor Andrew Cuomo, Senator James Seward, Senator John Bonacic, Senator George Amedore, Assembly Member Aileen Gunther, Assembly Member Kevin Cahill, Assembly Member Clifford Crouch, Assembly Member Pete Lopez, Assembly Member Claudia Tenney, as well as the Clerks of Sullivan, Ulster and Greene County Legislatures.

Pool- Councilman Joyce met with Rachel last week. The projected opening date for the pool is June 29th. Four individuals are currently attending the lifeguard training in Arkville who are planning to work here this summer. The switch to the chlorine system will be happening in the next couple weeks.

New Construction- Supervisor Donnelly stated that the new court construction is going very well. The quality of work is great both at the courthouse and railroad station. The bench should be started within the next two weeks. The carpet will be put down next week. The kitchen cabinets are in and the counter will be installed soon. There is still a door that needs to be hung. Once the carpet is in the trim can be completed. The stone sills will be installed by Artie.

Herr Road Cemetery- Councilman Cole will be seeking volunteers to help clean up the Herr Road Cemetery. He will have a firm date at the next meeting.

Local Law ~~2 of 2015~~ Town of Andes Flood Commission

A Local Law to establish The Town of Andes Flood Commission

BE IT ENACTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF ANDES, as follows:

Purpose:

The Town Board of the Town of Andes finds that it shall benefit its citizens to establish a town entity to oversee the Town's efforts and actions in regards to the hazard of flooding within the Town and in surrounding areas as it effects the Town. To that end, the Town Board of the Town of Andes shall hereby establish a public body through which the government of, the citizens of and employees of this Town may be informed of and protected as far as flooding in our area. This action shall also make it possible to coordinate flood protection with other agencies and groups for the benefit of the Town and its citizens.

Establishment; membership; terms of office

There is hereby established a nine member commission to be known as the "Town of Andes Flood Commission," consisting of seven (7) Town of Andes property owners to be appointed by the Supervisor and confirmed by the Town Board. The Town Highway Superintendent and the Town Code Enforcement Officer shall be the eighth and ninth members of the commission. Members appointed or reappointed shall hold office for a term of three years. At the initial establishment of the Commission, three members shall be appointed for terms of three years, two for terms of two years, and two for a term of one year. Thereafter the commissioners shall serve for the full three year term.

Compensation

The members of the Commission shall not receive compensation for their service on the board.

Meetings

The Commission shall meet from time to time as a majority of the members shall agree, by advance notification to the Town Clerk as to time, location and date of such meetings. The commission shall designate one of its members as Secretary of the Commission and shall keep all records in relation thereto. Such records shall be transmitted to the Town Clerk for public dissemination.

Powers and duties

It shall be the duty of the Commission to:

- Identify flood risks in the Town of Andes
- Educate & inform residents, businesses, government officials & local agencies of flood risks
- Work with local, state & federal officials & agencies to:
 1. Identify projects & programs that reduce the incidence & impacts of flooding
 2. Work together regionally & individually to fund & implement projects & associated programs throughout our area
 3. Enhance & encourage economic development in flood safe areas
 3. Educate Andes citizens and the wider public regionally as to the mitigation & flood planning and recovery efforts that are in process
- Work to coordinate & support local & regional communication & recovery efforts during declared disaster events across municipal boundaries
- Carry out other duties as the Town Board and Supervisor may assign from time to time.

Cooperation with other entities

The Commission shall welcome the cooperation with other municipalities, including Delaware County, the Delaware County Soil and Water District, with citizens, community service organizations, educational institutions, professional and technical organizations and other groups in carrying out its work.

Reports

The Commission shall from time to time report activities and initiatives to the Town Clerk's office to be distributed to the Town Board.

Effective date

This local law shall take effect immediately upon it being enacted in the filing of a certified copy hereof as required by law.

AGREEMENT between the Town Superintendent of the Town of Andes, Delaware County, New York, and the undersigned members of the Town Board.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 284 of the Highway Law, we agree that moneys levied and collected in the Town for the repair and improvement of highways, and received from the State for State Aid for the repair and improvement of highways, shall be expended as follows:

1. GENERAL REPAIRS. The sum of \$ 185,000 shall be set aside to be expended for primary work and general repairs upon 110 miles of town highways, including sluices, culverts and bridges having a span of less than five feet and boardwalks or the renewals thereof.

2. PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS. The following sums shall be set aside to be expended for the permanent improvement of town highways:

(a) On the road commencing at Bussey Hollow County Hwy 1 and leading to Bussey Hollow, a distance of 1 miles, there shall be expended not over the sum of \$ 50,000.

Dear Mr. Donnelly,

I am a member of Stop the Pipeline (STP), an all-volunteer grassroots group formed in the Spring of 2012 to stop construction of the "Constitution" Pipeline by a partnership including Williams as the primary owner, builder, and operator of the proposed project.

The many members of our group have spent thousands of hours researching the negative impacts of this project. One member in particular, Rachel Soper of Oneonta, has devoted herself to digging deep into the track records and outcomes of several similar pipeline projects and their builders, as well as Williams' own track record.

Rachel's research led her to submit the attached letter to FERC, the federal agency who saw fit to grant "Constitution" Pipeline a conditional permit on December 2, 2014. This letter initially highlights the gross shortcomings of the FERC approval process by enumerating a litany of violations accumulated by previously approved pipelines. These shortcomings undermine FERC's written guarantee that their oversight would assure compliance of environmental inspection and mitigation monitoring programs. Rachel then goes on to provide an analysis of Williams' track record as evidence that they've been bad actors in the past, and there's no reason to assume they will behave any differently in our county.

The fate of this project is in the hands of the NYS DEC. They have the power to halt construction of the "Constitution" Pipeline by applying the rigorous standards for water quality protections that they have set forth for our county and state. I urge you to read through this body of evidence carefully. As a result, I and all the members of STP, including the affected landowners facing eminent domain condemnation of their properties, hope you will join us in pressuring the DEC to deny "Constitution" the 401 Water Quality Certification, which is needed to begin construction.

I would appreciate this cover letter being read at the next Town Board meeting with copies of this letter and Rachel Soper's letter to FERC given to the Board Members.
