RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE RURAL CEMETERY ASSOCIATION OF ANDES, N. Y.

- I. All lots are held in pursuance of an act entitled "An Act authorizing the incorporation of Rural Cemetery Associations," passed April 27, 1847, and shall not be used for any other purpose than as a place of Burial of the Dead.
 - II. Proprietors shall not allow interments to be made in their Lots for a remuneration.
- III. No interment, except a member of the family or a relative of the proprietor, shall be permitted to take place in any burial Lot, without special permission from the Board of Trustees.
- IV. The proprietor of each Lot shall have the right to erect any proper Stones, Monuments, or Sepulchral structure thereon, and to cultivate trees, shrubs and plants in the same; not prohibited by law; but no tree growing within the Lot shall be cut down or destroyed without the consent of the Trustees.
- V. If any trees or shrubs situated in any Lot shall by means of their roots, branches or otherwise, become detrimental to adjacent Lots or Avenue, or dangerous or inconvenient to passengers, it shall be the duty of the officers of the Board of Trustees, and they shall have the right to enter the said Lots and remove the said trees and shrubs, or such parts thereof as are detrimental, dangerous or inconvenient.
- VI. If any Monument, Effigy, or inclosure, or any structure whatever, or any inscription be in or upon any Lot which shall be determined by the majority of the Trustees for the time being to be offensive, improper or injurious to the appearance of the surrounding Lots or Grounds, the said Trustees or a major part of them shall have the right, and it shall be their duty to enter upon such Lots and remove the said offensive or improper object or objects.
- VII. The proprietors of the Lots and their friends shall be allowed access to the Grounds at all times, observing the Rules which are or may be adopted for the regulation of visitors.
- VIII. The proprietor of each Lot shall keep in repair at his or her own expense, the landmarks of the same, which shall be erected by the Association.
- IX. It shall be the duty of the Board of Trustees from time to time to make such Rules and Regulations for the government of the Grounds, as they may deem requisite and proper, to secure and promote the general objects of the Association.
- X. All persons are prohibited from picking any flowers, either wild or cultivated; or breaking or cutting any tree shrub or plant.
- XI. No dis-interments shall be allowed without permission being obtained from the officers of the Board of Trustees.

By the provisions of the Act under which this Association is incorporated one-half of all moneys received from sale of Lots must be applied toward extinguishing debt and the other half expended in work upon the Cemetery grounds, and when the debt is cancelled the entire receipts shall be expended in improving said grounds.
