SEQR REVIEW - STORM-WATER PROJECT ON HIGH STREET & COULTER ROAD.

Margery Merzig, Keough Consulting, presented the following description of the scope of the projects:

Coulter Road Stormwater & Pavement Rehabilitation Project Town of Andes, Delaware County Project Description

Drainage improvements to be incorporated into the Coulter Road Drainage Improvements Project will include:

Installation/re-grading of approximately 1,900 LF of roadside ditches.

Installation of approximately 200 LF of stormwater conveyance piping and concrete gutters near the Post Office (corner of Coulter and Tremper Kill Roads).

Installation/replacement of approximately 900 LF of driveway culverts and stormwater conveyance piping.

Installation of two (2) Stormwater Treatment Units.

High Street Stormwater Improvements Project Town of Andes, Delaware County Project Description

Drainage improvements to be incorporated into the High Street Drainage Improvements Project will include:

Installation of approximately 450 LF of storm sewer.

Installation of approximately 550 LF of concrete gutter.

Installation of 60 LF of transverse drainage interceptor.

Installation of two (2) vortex separation stormwater treatment units.

Councilman Gabriel asked about the paving of the roads. High Street and Coulter Road will be bid with an alternate to pave the entire roadway. CWC will pay the original bid and the Town will cover through CHIPS funds the remaining. Since catch basins on Coulter Road will be repaired through the Sewer Fund., a portion of the highway paving on Coulter Road will be funded by the sewer budget

At the end of the presentation, having heard no additional comments from the Board or the public, she recommended that the Board declare no negative impact on the environment.

Dear Supervisor Donnelly:

As per our conversation on January 26, 2009 I am furnishing you with an update regarding Municipal Towers Sites in the Town of Andes.

As you know, JNS and the Town of Andes entered into an agreement in September 2008 to develop a communication tower to be located on town property (s). At the time, we had a wireless service provider (Crossroads Wireless) who had shown strong interest in locating on the tower. Unfortunately, Crossroads Wireless was unable to get funding for their system build-out and thus backed out of this location and others across New York State. In addition, shortly after Crossroads departure the national economy suffered a severe credit crisis and all service providers stopped spending money and have held this position up this moment.

We have posted the location (s) on our website and have repeatedly approached Verizon, AT&T, Sprint and T-Mobile on developing the tower (s) at these locations to service the town. We are optimistic that eventually conditions will change that will allow the carriers to continue the development of their systems. Until then we must wait.

Dear Judge McNamara,

On behalf of the Town of Andes, let me express the impact your decision will have on the less than 1,000 total residents of the Town of Andes.

Andes became subject to Chapter 556 on the NYS laws of 2002, known colloquially as the Large Parcel Law, in 2004. The Law has created wildly unrealistic and unpredictable real estate valuations in the Town. Because, as you know, the Town sets its equalization rate based on property valuations, the tax rate and levy on local property owners has been so unpredictable as to be nearly impossible to sustain. Andes Central School is gravely impacted by this unpredictability and the vn itself has seen great difficulty in funding its services, especially highway, because the ability to levy against the many "large parcels" is so uncertain.

I believe this law undermines our home rule to a very great degree. The Large Parcel law has created a climate of fear and resentment in our western Catskill towns. Local legislators like me are forced to enact rates which turn out to be unexpected and often incorrect in their application. My constituents over and over fight with me and my assessor on valuations over which we have no recourse. My Town's residents strongly support the local school, but the people are confused and discouraged. This is the impact of the Large Parcel law.

We were promised by the State Legislature that these provisions would be corrected, but with the strength of the NYC bloc at all levels of the Legislature, we see now that a judicial remedy may be the only way to eliminate the inequities existing in this statute. I sincerely hope you can see that this law is clearly unconstitutional. I and the Andes Town Board respectfully request that you decide to abolish and nullify the Large Parcel Law.

Thank you for your attention to the Town of Andes situation.

Dear Mr. Donnelly:

In accordance with your request, this letter will address solid waste managed at the Town transfer station. Please note that the transfer stations within the Delaware County system are owned and operated by the Towns. As such, the Towns have all control on the management of the waste and recyclables up until the time that it is actually placed in a County box. Once in the County box, it becomes the County property and any unauthorized removal is a theft of County property. The County does not allow scavenging from any box for two reasons. The first is liability and the second is loss of revenue. The liabilities of having someone enter the box to retrieve an item is the largest concern. It is extremely unsafe from the perspective of unstable, shifting loads, exposure to pathogens and just generally dangerous to a human. No one should ever enter a box.

It should be noted however, that "reuse" is the highest priority on the State's hierarchy of Waste Management. The State strongly supports the reuse of items for their intended purpose. The County's Solid Waste Management Plan also encourages reuse where feasible. The County's plan goes as far as suggesting the construction and operation of a "salvage facility" at the County Solid Waste Management Center where people can drop off their unwanted but reusable products that some other person might need. We have not constructed the facility due to concerns over costs and management. The County does actively encourage individuals and institutions to work with nonprofit organizations where possible to find homes for reusable items. The Town's management of these items on the Town owned transfer station property is certainly consistent with the County plan. Every reusable item removed from the waste stream prior to being placed in a County box saves everyone money. It obviously benefits the person who is going to avoid the purchase of the item. It benefits the County taxpayer in saving the cost of transporting the item and ultimately disposing of it.

In my opinion, you run your transfer station very well. You observe the County rules on recycling and disposal, maintain your facilities in a neat condition, provide for the reuse of many items and maximize the weight of material to be transported in the County boxes.

1. WWTP Plant

• Plant effluent flows averaged 41,400 gallons per day for the month of January 2010.

2. SPDES Compliance/NYSDEC, NYCDEP

• The plant discharges of treated effluent to the Tremper Kill Brook; permit compliance for January 2010 did not meet all parameters. On January 26, 2010 the SBR's were in storm mode due to the heavy rain. In storm mode two micro and sand filters need to be on line. # 2 micro unit began short cycling (excessive backwashing to the head of the plant) and had to be taken off line and cleaned (CIP) which resulted in **bypassing** a portion of the flow around this unit.

3. Collection System

High Street is being maintained as required.

4. Plant Purchases.

• Delaware Operations request the approval to purchase 125 feet of 3/16" stainless steel chain from McMaster-Carr at a cost of \$8.72 per foot plus shipping. The chain will be used to replace the deteriorated chain that is attached to the five pumps that are in the bottom of the SBR.

5. Plant O&M

• Delaware Operations request approval for the yearly PM contract with Cummins Northeast for the generator at the WWTP. The cost of semi annual routine maintenance is \$1640.83.

6. Plant Equipment

125 feet of 3/16" stainless steel chain - McMaster & Carr - \$8,72 per foot + shipping

In follow-up to my phone call, I am writing to let you now that, after reviewing your request and the requirements set by the Town Board and Planning Board, the Andes Town Board has taken the following actions:

1. The Town Board has recognized that the road in your development has met the standards set by the Town for road specifications.

2. The Town Board has recognized that your completion of the road in your development preceded the moratorium set in 2008 and therefore can be grandfathered in as a town road.

3. Your development has not yet reached the valuation required to establish a town maintained road. Therefore the Town Board has agreed to accept your road as a "seasonal use road", but agrees to accept it as a fully maintained Town Road, as soon as the valuation reaches \$1,000,000.

Please inform the Town Board the name you wish to assign to the road. We will let you know of its acceptance as soon as we can.
