1989 John Deere Grader- changed oil, greased and installed new brake cable

2004 International- changed oil and greased, 11,530 miles, checked rear end

2000 International- greased, checked rear end and installed new exhaust pipe, 87,160 miles

Roads-

Sluice pipes have been installed on Bussey Hollow Road through FEMA.

Bussey Hollow Road, Dingle Hill Road, Davis Hollow Road, Little Dingle Hill Road, and Murphy Hill Road have all been worked.

On Mary Smith Road we have been installing larger pipes.

I have filed permits with DEC in order to install new tubes for Cross Mountain, Mary Smith, Beech Hill, and Davis Hollow. These will all be covered by the FEMA projects.

We have begun ditching Fish Hollow Road through the CHIPS program. We have been hauling stone rubble from Fish Hollow back to the Andes pit. There has been approximately 200 loads.

We have begun hauling sand from LaFever's pit back to Andes.

On Saturday, July 9, we had to do emergency work on Barkaboom Road. Pictures from this site will be attached to the Highway Report. The concrete barriers fell into the brook, about 30 feet down. We pulled them back out with the backhoe.

The 2004 and 2005 FEMA projects need to be completed within 18 months from when the disaster was declared. In order to complete all these projects we will have to work overtime.

We will not be able to put dust pads down until money is received from FEMA to put back in the highway accounts.

FEMA and I have been going out once a week to visit the sites. At the rate FEMA is working this will not be completed until next year.

We will have pictures on the computer for people to look at from the spring flood.

July 12, 2005

1. WWTP Plant

• Plant effluent flows averaged 18,000 gallons per day for the month of June.

2. SPDES Compliance/NYSDEC, NYCDEP

• The plant discharges of treated effluent to the Tremper Kill Brook; permit compliance for June was met in all parameters but phosphorus and effluent temperature to the receiving water. The process has been modified by adding Alum to the treatment process and all testing since has been within limits. We have discussed the temperature issue with NYSDEC and will request a permit modification to address this issue.

3. Septage Receiving

• Contact has been made with septage haulers and we should start receiving septage in the next two weeks.

4. Lateral Connections

• The contractors working on lateral connections currently have made (103) one hundred and three residential connections and (16) sixteen commercial connections. The start of restoration and filling of depressions has also taken place.

5. Water System

- Daily usage of treated water from the water system averaged 38,900 gallons per day for the month of June.
- Lead and copper samples results have been received (see attached letter) and NYSDOH has lowered the sampling requirements to 5 sites annually with the next set to be collected during the period of June-September 2006.
- The valve box for the hydrant in the Towns Office parking lot was found damaged while doing system maintenance. Quotes have been obtained for repairs form two contractors With CA Phillips Corp. being the lowest at \$250.00, we recommend the repairs be made by CA Phillips Corp. at a price not to exceed \$250.00.

Dear Supervisor Donnelly and board members:

We have received your results of lead and copper sampling for the period of January – June 2005. Your continued cooperation in conducting this required sampling is appreciated.

Of the ten sample results reported, none exceeded 0.015 mg/l lead and none exceeded 1.3 mg/l copper. The 90th percentile level for lead was 0.004 mg/l and the 90th percentile level for copper was 0.95 mg/l. Therefore, the "action level" for neither lead nor copper has been exceeded. Your treatment program of zinc orthophosphate has been successful. You are now considered to be in compliance with the requirements to provide optimum corrosion control treatment. The corrosion control treatment program must continue indefinitely.

You must continue to conduct similar sampling during future years, but the <u>monitoring</u> may be reduced to five (5) sites annually. The next set of samples must be collected during the period June – September 2006. When reporting results in the future, we request you continue to use the enclosed **RESULTS** form and **REPORT AND CERTIFICATION** form.

If the lead and copper results do not exceed the action levels for three consecutive years, a further reduction in the sampling frequency (to once every three years) is possible.

TOWN OF ANDES LOCAL LAW #1 OF 2005

A LOCAL LAW THE AUTHORIZING THE IMPOSITION OF FINES AND FEES FOR CODE VIOLATIONS AND FOR THE COLLECTION THEREOF

BE IT ENACTED BY the Town Board of the Town of Andes, Delaware County, State of New York

Section 1:

There shall be added a new provision entitled, "Section 7.02 Other Enforcement Proceedings; Refusal to comply; procedure; expenses.

The Town may institute any appropriate action or proceeding to prevent a violation of this law, to restrain, correct, or abate such violation, or to prevent the illegal use of land, building or structures.

In addition to any penalty provided for in this Article, upon the refusal or neglect of the person, officer or institution, to correct a violation and at least ten (10) days after the Code Enforcement Officer, by first class mail has served a notice of the same directing corrective action to the last known address on the tax assessment roles of the Town, the Code Enforcement Officer may take such steps to correct any condition where the same exists, which may reasonably place the public at risk.

Such actions shall include, but not be limited to the removal of trash or any other article from property or the securing, or demolition of any buildings or structures or may cause such work to be done and shall thereafter file a Certificate of Expense thereof, together with a description of the property upon which such action was taken, with the Town Clerk, who shall certify the same to the Town Board at the next regular meeting thereafter, and the expense of such action, demolition, removal, making safe or secure or other such action, (together with an addition Administrative Fee of 50% of the cost thereof, or \$500.00, whichever is less), shall be paid by the owner of said property to the Town and may be collected in a proceeding pursuant to General Municipal Law, § 78-b, or by action at law or may be determined and assessed against the real property upon which such action was taken and collected in the same manner as the general town and county taxes as provided by law.

If at any time the Code Enforcement Office shall be prohibited from carrying out the provisions of this section or any other section of this statute because the owner or an agent for the owner has refused access to the property, the Code Enforcement Officer, either on his own, or with the aid of the Town Attorney, shall apply to any Town Justice, or any other court of competent jurisdiction to obtain a warrant to go upon such property, and to obtain from such court any further direction, or protection, as he may deem necessary. Any costs incurred in obtaining such warrant, including reasonable attorney's fees, shall be added to the Certificate of Expense as set forth above.

Section 2.

This local law shall take effect upon the filing with the Secretary of State of the State of New York.

FROM THE ASSESSOR:

Early in the month I arranged for more memory to be installed on the Assessors' computer, and that has now been completed. I have answered questions and helped several Property owners, Surveyors and Appraiser's this month. I have also received several letters verifying sales and property inventories, which were processed.

In the field - I continue the process of taking photographs of every building and downloading the information on to the computer.

As always my office is open to help the public whenever possible. With summer upon us, it is best to call ahead to make sure that I will be in the office as my work often takes me into the field.
