\*Earlier this month it was brought to my attention of bank erosion near the upper end of High Street near the bridge by John Andrews house. I reached out to Graydon Dutcher of Delaware County Soil and Water District. They were to come out and look at the situation. I have not received and update at this time.

\*There was an issue with a frozen water line on Delaware Ave, which ended up being a collapsed/pinched line over the river. The repair will be made in the spring.

\*We experienced a mechanical issue at the transfer station, which has now been resolved. Thank you to Shayne for overseeing the repair and a huge thank you to the residents and staff for dealing with any inconvenience it created while dropping off their garbage.

\*Delaware County Emergency Services has supplied all Towns with free COVID test kits for residents. Thank you to the Post Office who distributed the first batch and the Emergency Squad for the distribution of the second batch. Especially thanks to the Andrews Family for their service to the squad and overseeing the distribution of the kits. I have another batch which will again be distributed by the Emergency Squad in the near future.

\*The Streetscape group met to discuss further plans of repairing/painting the benches in the Hamlet. They will also be seeking Delaware County Tourism Grant funding to update the kiosk.

\*Also this month we had a water damage issue at the Town Court. Thank you to Tom Joyce and Al Mohr for overseeing the repairs. The repairs should be completed soon.

\*I have in the past couple months been reaching out to different gas companies for an interest in opening a station in Andes. A few weeks ago, Town Justice Nick Burton, brought to my attention a gentleman who had interest in pursuing it. I met with him to discuss this and we looked at different sites. Further information will be announced as it becomes available.

\*In a conversation with Scott Norwalk of NYS DOT, the manhole cover on State Highway 28 was repaired by Cobleskill Stone, who did the re-topping of the road and damaged it at that time. We also discussed the local law of no overnight parking in the hamlet in the winter months and the posting of signs in regards to this. He stated the NYS DOT does not install or maintain these types of signs and it would be up to the Town to do so.



\*I met with Jim, John, and Laurie Andrews regarding the County's resolution to support the proposed county commercial ambulance service. They wanted me to know they support it and support me in voting for it, which I will do and I hope I have the board's support also. This is a much needed service in the whole county because of the lack of volunteers. This will be a mutual aid service as some towns have no ambulance service within their townships. The contract will be with AMR. The ambulances will be marked as Delaware County Ambulances to lessen any confusion when their on a call and at a hospital.

Assessor Report

I have been notified by the New York State Real Property Tax Service that the Town of Andes will need to raise assessments again this year due to the large influx of new property sales at much higher Sales values. The property assessment will need to be raised in order to maintain our 100% equalization rate. Failure to raise the assessments will lower the equalization rate and cause the tax rates to go up without any notice to our taxpayers. **Districts:****Water-****Sewer-****Annual Audit:**

Town Bookkeeper, Karen Kropp of By the Books, provided a presentation to the board regarding the bank account balances and the state of each fund. The “COVID” money is labeled as a liability in the General Fund at this time. The general fund increased its fund balance by roughly \$124,000. Major reasons for this included increased building permit revenue and mortgage tax. The highway fund balance appears to have decreased but will correct itself when the CHIPS money is received by the Town in March. The fund balance in 2021 started at \$780,000 and will increase by roughly \$200,000. The Sewer District added \$12,000 to its fund balance, however the fund balance is still negative. The Water district decreased its fund balance by roughly another \$21,000.

The Town Board reviewed the records of the Town Clerk and Water and Sewer District Clerk. All was found to be in order.

Dear Town of Andes:

We would like to take the time to thank you for considering this letter of request to lower the speed limit from 55 miles per hour to 45 miles per hour or less after the ~~30~~ 30 miles per hour sign, heading South, past the Andes Fire Hall on County Highway 1. In discussing this with Dan from Delaware County Department of Public Works, he asked that to "get the ball rolling" in the correct direction, to first write and contact you.

In the last three years, there has been a dramatic increase in pedestrian traffic on County Highway 1 from people in town, country, and state. Specifically, this walking traffic exists for about two miles past the Andes Fire Hall heading South toward the Pepacton Reservoir. Likewise, an influx and change in demographics; more children and disabled adults are living on the sharp curve outside 4987 County Highway 1 and beyond.

As traffic continues to grow on foot and with cars on this road, we kindly ask that the speed limit be lowered sufficiently, to help keep our pedestrians, visitors, community members, and pets/animals in a safer living environment. Could we lower the speed limit to encourage more awareness of these dynamic surroundings several miles past the Andes Fire Hall heading South on County Highway 1? If possible, could we also add a solar LED speed sign to help deter excessive speeds?

Thank you again for your time, consideration, and thoughtfulness about this safety concern. We appreciate all you do for our community, its members, and our children.

**Re: NYS Water Infrastructure Improvement Act (WIIA) Drinking Water Grant  
Engineering Services Proposal**

Supervisor Gladstone,

Cedarwood Engineering Services, PLLC (Cedarwood) has prepared the following proposal for the Town of Andes to apply for WIIA grant funding to develop, treat, and connect the Cemetery Road Well to the Towns Public Water Supply.

The project to be funded includes; performing a pilot study to determine a cost effective treatment system for the removal of hydrogen sulfide, design a treatment system based on the results of the pilot test, design a treatment building, and design the physical connect of the new source well and treatment to the existing water system, and add a redundant well to meet maximum day demand.

Although the next round (2022) of WIIA grant funding has yet to be announced, the documents that are typically required are as follows:

- Engineering Report, including a project schedule and project budget
- Smart Growth Assessment Form
- Environmental Review Determination
- SHPO Project Review Determination Letter
- DWSRF Financing Application (Required if applying for WIIA with DWSRF Financing)
  - If applying for DWSRF financing the Town will also need a Bond Resolution (Certified).
  - For grant only applications, a Certified Board Resolution is required.

Cedarwood will complete the required documents, listed above, for WIIA grant funding application at a **not to exceed cost of \$18,000.**

Although the full list of application requirements are not yet available, Cedarwood has prepared this proposal based upon the most recent requirements listed for WIIA grant applications. During the previous grant application round, project readiness was stressed as a deciding factor in application review by the Environmental Facilities Corporation (EFC). By electing to proceed with the application requirements at this time, the Town should be in good position to meet the grant application requirements when they become available.

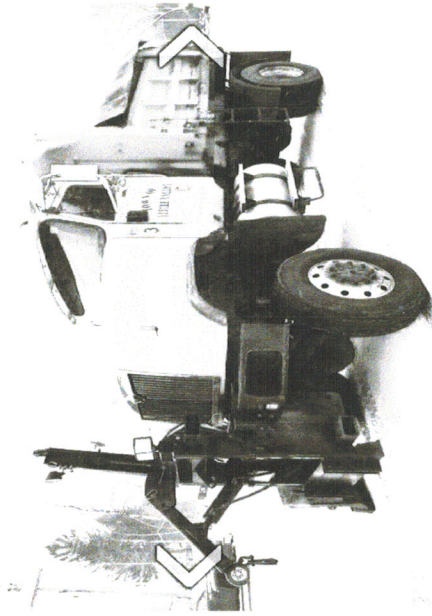
