**Privilege of the Floor:**

-Sue Gladstone spoke about grants and funds that can be set up and obtained through the Mark Project. Some of the grant projects that are already in the works are: A daycare center in Arkville and grants for low income housing. Another grant idea being worked on is a project for senior citizens to set up an apartment (\$15,000 per unit) in their home for a live-in caregiver. Kirkside Project could also help local farmers with a refrigerated truck to transport products from local farms. Sue will publish contact info in the gazette.

-Cindy Wright will be giving a Comprehensive Management presentation at the Hunting Tavern on November 17th There is a lot that the town needs to consider because of the influx of people we have seen in the past 2 years. The main topic of the presentation will be "What makes tourists

come to Andes?" Parking, WiFi, garbage and cell service will also be discussed. Cindy also mentioned that she asked MTC about setting up WiFi hotspots in Andes and that several local businesses are on board with this idea.




